What You Can Do From the ProClass Portal

The ProClass Portal is a powerful tool used by ILR to help you renew your membership and sign up for classes -- but there is more, a lot more you can do. Once you have logged into the ProClass Portal on the upper right-hand side of the screen, at the bottom of the blue box there is a gear and your name. Click on your name. The screen will change and, on the left hand-side in the white body of the screen, there will be three buttons: My Account, Change Password and Log Out. Go back to this menu at any time by clicking on your name next to the gear.

If you click on the My Account button, the screen will display information that we have about your account.

The first section is titled **Personal Information** with items like name, email address and phone numbers, to name a few. If you change any information in this top section under home phone

number, you will find a Save button. If you want the change or changes saved, then click the Save button. You will need to make sure there are no errors reported on the save; errors may be reported at the top of page.

The second section is *Contacts*. This section should contain just your name. We have a few accounts that were set up with the help of ProClass as family accounts and those may have a second name. *PLEASE DO NOT ADD CONTACT INFORMATION FOR ANOTHER PERSON IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD TO YOUR ACCOUNT.* It does and will cause problems later on.

Just below the Contacts is a tab bar with the following tabs:

Addresses, My Registration, Invoices, Payments, Memberships, Credit Card

Addresses – Lists the address that we have on file for you; there is a green check mark by the address that should be your current primary address. If you need to make changes to your address, click on the note pad with the pencil . You can make the necessary changes and then click save. If you have multiple addresses, you can click on the note pad with the pencil . Then scroll down and you will see three buttons: Save, Cancel, Delete. Save – will save any changes to the address, Cancel – will not save any changes, and Delete - will delete that record. If you have an address record with a type of W-9, please contact someone on the ILR Finance team to update that information and please do not delete it.

<u>My Registration</u> – Lists the courses that you had/have registered for; there may be multiple pages.

Invoices – Lists the invoices for membership, course registration and any donations.

Payments – Lists the payment and the method of payment.

<u>Memberships</u> – Lists the memberships that you have/had with ILR. We are not set up to do auto renewal, so do not check that box.

<u>Credit Card</u> – Lists the credit/debit card(s) that we have on file for your account. If your current credit/debit card has a new expiration date, click on the note pad with the pencil . That will display a screen where you can update expiration date. To add a new card, click on Add a Credit Card.

Four items to note:

- 1. **Security Code** Leave blank. This is for your security of your credit/debit card.
- 2. **Allow Recurring Charges?** Should NOT be checked. We do not do monthly billings like your internet or cable company.
- Confirmation Email Address Leave blank. If you were to change your email address
 in the personal information section and you have your old email address entered here,
 all the emails from ILR will still be going to the email address with the credit card.
- 4. Securely store card to Bluesnap for recurring payments? Needs to be checked.

When done, click on the Save button.

To remove a credit/debit card click on the note pad with the pencil . Then scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on the Delete button.

If you click on the Change Password button, you will be able to select a new password, confirm it and then click on Submit. This option may not work if your account is one of the accounts set up as family.

The last button is Log Out. This is the graceful way to end your portal session. ProClass will also log you out if you X out.

Beware of Gift Card Scams

Unfortunately, **it can happen to many of us:** You answer the telephone and the caller tells you something terrible will happen unless you send them money, share a password or purchase some gift cards for them **IMMEDIATELY**.



You may believe you must act quickly to avoid a disaster, but that is exactly what the scammers hope you will do. **Please fight that urge and simply hang up.** Otherwise, they win and you lose.

Here are some basic tips to help keep you from sharing your hard-earned dollars with scammers who target you via telephone, email or text message:

- **Be selective** with whom you share your phone number and email information.
- Do not click on links in an email unless you are 100 percent sure it is a safe website.
- No reputable organization **including ILR** will call and ask you to purchase gift cards.

Member Survey Provides Valuable Feedback

ILR continually strives to meet the needs and preferences of our members. In order to obtain information from members about what might be added or changed, the Marketing Committee distributed a survey last April to everyone enrolled in in-person courses. We thought you might be interested in an **overview of a few of the general findings**.

A total of 489 people – 117 males and 363 females – completed the surveys. The majority of respondents were in the 65-74 years age range, followed closely by those in the 75-84 range. Other key findings:

- Most respondents have been ILR members for 1 5 years and many for 6 10 years;
- 75 percent of responders **became aware of ILR offerings through friends** (as opposed to the website, Facebook or other avenues of communication);
- Lecture was identified as the preferred form of course delivery (as opposed to workshop or discussion group formats);
- Most respondents identified history as a general course topic of interest (compared to religion, science, literature, health or the arts;
- 29 individuals indicated that they would be interested in volunteering with ILR.

This information is valuable to us – many thanks to those who completed a survey!



Instructor Profile: Father Andrew Harmon

Longtime ILR instructor Father Andrew Harmon has decided that he benefits as much as his students every time he steps into a classroom.

"I teach to learn," he says. "ILR students are pretty smart and ask lots of good questions, so for some subjects I need to dig in deep by reading a lot and cramming to prepare for class."



For nearly 15 years, Fr. Andrew has offered courses on history and religion, and sometimes both topics combined – for example, the history of Christianity. His appreciation for both disciplines is reflected in his choices for academic credentials: a master of divinity degree and a bachelor of arts in history. Fueled by endless curiosity, he has also led classes on "bad people throughout history," such as Adolph Hitler and Mao Zedong, plus unconventional events like the Salem Witch Trial.

"I get to learn about a lot of topics I wouldn't discover otherwise," he says about his thematic approach. "I've really fallen in love with some subjects."

His greatest satisfaction, however, is **interacting with and getting to know the people who attend his classes.** He describes the classroom – when compared to an online class or formal work setting – as a "free-wheeling atmosphere. The discussions can take you wherever you want."

Fr. Andrew's full-time commitment for the past 34 years was serving as pastor at St. Matthew's Orthodox Church in North Royalton. **He retired in late July** to travel and spend more time with his family, which includes his wife Bonnie, six grown children and nine grandchildren.

Anything else on his to-do list? "I'd like to start taking some ILR classes myself," he professes.

ILR Experts to Speak at National Conference

Two ILR instructors have been invited to share their expertise on a national level this fall.

Instructors **Bev Sadowski and Doug Horne will speak at the JFK Historical Group Dallas 2024 Conference** to be held from Nov. 21-23. As **keynote speaker**, Doug will review medical evidence regarding the 1963 JFK assassination. Bev's presentation will focus on Robert Kennedy's assassination.

The mission of the JFK Historical Group, according to the organization's website, is "to change the historical reality associated with the political assassinations of the 1960s by bringing to light new information uncovered by researchers, journalists and historians."

From the ILR Help Desk

Recent question from an ILR member: "What is this S24-XX and why did you use it?"

Examples: REPEAT from Spring '22 (S24-02) or NEW (S24-03)

Answer: It is a way for ILR to keep track of the courses that we offer. The number breaks down into three sections:

- The first item is the quarter F for Fall, W for Winter and S for Spring.
- The second item is **the last two digits of the year of the course**; i.e., 24 for 2024, or 25 for 2025. The dash is just a separator to make it easier to read.
- The third item (the last two digits) is a **sequence number** starting with 01 for the first course on Monday morning and ending with the last class on Thursday.

This numbering system allows the courses to be displayed on our website in a sequence that is by day and time, since without the number the courses would be listed alphabetically. Another item is that some courses have the same or remarkably similar starting titles, and the number makes it easier for you to know that you have selected the course in which you are interested.

ILR also uses the course numbers to **send out class reminders** and keep track of the handouts for the different courses. (Please remember that we offer 40 or more courses for each of the three quarters and about half of them have handouts.)

Resources for Seniors: How to Find the Help You Need

Many older adults want to stay in their own homes as long as possible, but regular maintenance and repairs, plus adaptations for aging, can present multiple challenges. Fortunately, **many states and municipalities offer myriad senior assistance programs** to provide advice or direct help.

Below is a **brief directory of online resources**, for needs ranging from home modifications to Social Security benefits, that you may wish to investigate as a starting point:

- <u>National Association of Area Agencies on Aging</u>: A national association that allows seniors to search for their local Area Agency on Aging
- <u>Benefits Check Up</u>: A free, confidential service from the National Council on Aging that matches seniors with assistance programs and services for which they may be eligible
- <u>AARP Foundation's Guide to Public Benefits</u>: A free online directory that helps older adults learn about the benefits available to them in their states
- <u>Benefits.gov</u>: A federal government site that allows seniors to browse available benefits or use the finder tool to discover programs and services that may apply to them
- Social Security: Answers to frequently asked questions
- <u>State Health Insurance Assistance Programs (SHIPs)</u>: A free service that provides counseling to Medicare beneficiaries
- Hearing Aid Resources: A list of programs at both the national and state level


