# Winter 2024 Class Registration Begins Dec. 3

Online class registration for Winter 2024 will begin Dec. 3, 2023, at 12:01 a.m. EST. We will offer in-person class registration from 10:30 to 11:45 a.m. at the ILR office at 325 Front Street, Berea (parking is available in the back, off of Adalbert Street) on Monday, Dec. 4; Tuesday, Dec. 5; Wednesday, Dec. 6; Friday, Dec. 8; Monday, Dec. 11; and Thursday, Dec. 14. Class registration will close on Dec. 17 at 11:00 p.m.

#### **Behind the Scenes After Class Registration Closes**

ILR has a set date that class registration closes for every quarter and, out of necessity, we cannot accept late registrations. Several volunteers devote many hours to perform the following tasks after registration closes, including but not limited to:

Canceling class(es) – If the class minimum has not been reached or the instructor needs to cancel, we will cancel the class. We try to reach out to each student in the

class via email and phone calls to notify them that the class is being canceled, and ask if they want a different class or a refund.

- Clearing waitlist The class size is set in one of three ways: by the instructor, by ILR, or by the limit that the room will hold. We contact the instructor to see if the class size can be increased or not (if the class size was set by the instructor). If ILR set the class size, what is the density of other classes in that time slot at that location, so as not to overrun the available parking spaces. Can we move the class to a different room within the location or change location? If the size can be increased, then we start to clear the waitlist(s).
- Creating reports Attendance sheets and a student contact list are prepared for each class so the coordinator knows who will attend. ILR runs 38 to 41 classes each quarter.
- Creating an email list for each class so class reminders and surveys can be sent out.
- Creating for each class the class reminder.

**Please join me in celebrating our volunteers** who put in a lot of effort that often goes unnoticed.

# Volunteer Profile: Lois McNabb, Host Coordinator by Dan Bomeli



ILR Host Coordinator **Lois McNabb** recalls the time an instructor was having trouble with a projector, so Lois headed down the hallway and found help from... **a tutu-clad ballet dancer** who popped into the classroom and got everything running correctly.

Situations (and solutions) like this are uncommon, and Lois enjoys the coordinator role she has filled for more than a decade. "I like meeting with people who are taking classes," she says. "Instructors are also very interesting to get to know."

Lois, a long-time Brook Park resident, was a nurse at Lutheran Hospital for 42 years and heard about ILR while earning her bachelor's degree at Baldwin Wallace. She began taking ILR classes after retiring in 2001.

"I've been busy ever since I retired," she says. In addition to coordinating two ILR courses every quarter, **Lois volunteers extensively** with her church and is active in a social organization whose members are all named Lois.

At ILR, Host Coordinators are responsible for taking attendance, ensuring that classrooms are set up properly, any handouts are ready and performing other duties to support the instructor. Additionally, coordinators benefit by sitting in on classes **without having to pay the course fee**. This perk allows Lois to choose courses of special interest to her.

"ILR is the perfect solution for retirees," she says. "I've become friends with people I've met." And Lois is happy to provide a valuable service through her volunteer efforts.

"If there were no ILR Host Coordinators," she says, "it would be difficult to run the classes."
